St James' RC Primary School welcomed the Sion Catholic Community



In October, St James' RC Primary School welcomed the Sion Catholic Community. For more than 30 years the Sion Community have been running parish missions and school missions across the UK working under the authority of the Catholic Bishops of England and Wales.

They presented the Gospel message in a modern, lively and stimulating way and encouraged us all to take a fresh look at our faith and to live it more deeply. They delivered thought-provoking assemblies, presentations, classroom sessions and prayer times.

A variety of methods were used to bring the Gospel to life during the mission such as drama, video, PowerPoint presentations, puppet shows, music and song, actions,

movement, games, humour, question and answer sessions, personal testimonies, Scripture, prayer, reflection and silence. The mission culminated in a whole school Mass on All Saints' Day and a KS2 presentation to parents, parishioners and governors.

The Sion Community were introduced to the school by the school's Parish Priest and the mission was an example of how our Parish, School and homes work closely together. The four members of the Sion Community worked with the school for three days. They led a session for governors, stayed in parishioners' homes and met with parents at the start of every day after leading staff prayers.

On Wednesday 4th March 2020 Ursuline College were thrilled to be invited to take part in a visit with HRH The Earl of Wessex at Dover Christchurch Academy to thank local schools and organisations for running the Duke of Edinburgh's Award.

The visit was also to showcase how more young people, businesses and schools could benefit from doing the DofE. During the event, silver DofE participants Melody Bayley, Tilly Garratt, Leila Kirby, Jordan Nyirenda, Scarlett O'Donovan and Olivia Read showcased their first aid skills for HRH including demonstrating use of a choking vest, CPR with dummy and their bandaging skills.

HRH was particularly keen to see them using the choking vest to demonstrate and practice how to deal with an incident of choking within their team as he said this was something he had not seen before.

Everyone seeing our participant's demonstration complimented them on their presentation skills and the confident way they interacted with the visiting dignitaries and HRH himself. The participants said of the visit "We thoroughly enjoyed presenting our first aid training to Prince Edward. We are honoured that we were granted this opportunity to meet such an inspirational member of the royal family".

Richard Challoner School is one of the highest performing schools in England



Richard Challoner School in New Malden has been recognised nationally by receiving prestigious awards for its outstanding Key Stage 4 and 5 results last year. The awards are based on 2019 data provided by the Department for the Schools, Students and Teachers (SSAT) network.

Richard Challoner School was found to be among the best performing non-selective secondary schools and Sixth Forms in the country, receiving three awards for being in the top 10% nationally for attainment and for being in DfE Band 1 for student progress at key stage 4. The school was also recognised for being in the top 20% nationally for student attainment in academic subjects at Key Stage 5.

Mr Sean Maher, Head Teacher at Richard Challoner School commented: "We are hugely proud of this achievement. Receiving these awards once again is a wonderful affirmation of all the hard

work of students, staff and parents to ensure that all our students, whatever their background or academic ability, achieve their full potential".

Students from Richard Challoner School will join winners from across the country at a ceremony to collect their award later this year.
