# Primary Religious Education Conference – Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> to Friday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2023 Aylesford Priory – Residential Option

This two-day residential conference is for those who lead religious education in Catholic primary schools. Our main focus will be the implementation of the new Religious Education Directory (RED) with sessions on Thursday led by **Dr Nancy Walbank**, **Senior Education Policy Adviser for the Catholic Education Service**. Elaine Arundell, from the Diocese of Westminster Education Service, will present on how using song in religious education and collective worship can support schools in meeting the requirements of the CSI framework. Friday will include: a session on sharing good practice with several RE leads presenting; a time to reflect on the vocational nature of the role of the RE/CW/CL lead and a Mass celebrated by Canon Victor Darlington, the Episcopal Vicar for Education. <u>Click here</u> to book.

## **Religious Education Directory (RED) – Update**

The final text version of the RED has been approved by the Bishops' Conference and has been shared with dioceses, but we have been asked not share with schools until the final formatted version is published. A formal launch of the document has been planned for 25<sup>th</sup> January. Following on from that we will be sharing the document with schools.

Given this delay to the publication of the directory, schools are advised to treat the remaining terms of this academic year as planning terms once the final text is shared and that teaching of the RED begins from September 2023. Full implementation is still required by September 2025.

The RE advisers are in the process of planning a series of CPD sessions which directly address the changes to the RE curriculum in all phases. This includes the Primary and Secondary RE Conferences.

Learning about the Liturgical Year adds an extra rich dimension to the teaching of R.E and to the prayer life of the school. This section is meant to provide some ideas; people and events, which may be incorporated into the lessons and prayer times.

## January 2023

## February 2023

Pope Francis' prayer request is for Parishes: We pray that parishes, placing communion at the centre, may increasingly become communities of faith, fraternity and welcome towards those most in need. (See also <u>http://www.popesprayerusa.net/</u>.)

This year the first 21 days of February falls during the liturgical season of Ordinary Time, which is represented by the liturgical colour green. The remaining days of February fall within Lent. The liturgical colour changes to violet or purple — a symbol of penance, mortification and the sorrow of a contrite heart.
