
Restructure and name change

To know You more clearly: Religious Education Directory (RED)

Primary: New implementation date: September 2026. Secondary implementation date remains September 2025.

The Bishops agreed to defer the implementation of the Religious Education Directory (RED) to 2026 for ages 3 to 11 years at their plenary meeting in November 2023.


Article 8 of the General Norms in the Religious Education Directory has, therefore, been amended for the purposes of ages 3 to 11 so that 2026 replaces 2025 at the request of the Bishops Conference.

We are asking that primary school leaders refrain from making decisions about how to implement the RED until we are able to provide informed guidance in regard to resources and timescales. Initial introductory training events for school (including curriculum) leaders will continue to take place throughout the current academic year. Please continue using your current programme of work.

Living and Learning the Liturgical Year

Learning about the Liturgical Year adds an extra rich dimension to the teaching of R.E and to the prayer life of the school. This section is meant to provide some ideas; people and events, which may be incorporated into the lessons and prayer times.

March 2024

Pope Francis prayer request for March for the new martyrs: We pray that those who risk their lives for the Gospel in various parts of the world inflame the Church with their courage and missionary enthusiasm.

The entire month of March, except the 31st, falls during the liturgical season of Lent which is represented by the liturgical colour violet or purple — a symbol of penance, mortification and the sorrow of a contrite heart. All saint days that are usually Memorials are shifted to Optional Memorials during the season of Lent. The 31st March marks the beginning of the Easter Season and is represented by the liturgical colour of white.
