## School Place Planning

Last Friday, there was a further meeting of representatives from London borough education teams, unions, DfE and dioceses. The issue of surplus school places remains challenging across all of London and in the south LAs particularly. In general, making reductions to PAN has not resolved the problem and in 10 months time it is expected that there will be significant further school closures in addition to those that have happened to date. This year there are fewer pupils in reception classes than in year 7 so as the changes make their way into high schools it will have an impact there too.

We have emphasized before, the need to ensure it is easy for parents wanting a Catholic education to be able to apply to our schools. The other aspect is for schools to ensure they remain financially viable and to remodel staffing structures in good time to avoid moving into deficits. Working together in families of schools such as in the Catholic Academy Trusts assists with making savings. Several schools have worked closely with their Trust Relationship Officer Sam, Daniel or myself to resolve situations and ensure that LAs are acting reasonably. I can assure you that we do not have conversations about school closures with any LA without involving the headteacher and chair. Any school called to a meeting with their LA to change PAN or look at closure must contact us immediately- provision in Church schools is not a role of governing bodies or LAs it is a decision for the Diocesan trust.

Thank you to those headteachers and chairs for coming forward and seeking help rather than risk an increasing deficit. It is a governing body role to propose a break-even budget in a school or academy. Academy boards must ensure their reserves policy is met when all the budgets are consolidated. We are here to help.

Some boroughs will be issuing financial warning notices as they move into next year. What you cannot do as leadership is hope the problem will go away. The problem is going to be around for at least the next 10 years and local authorities are not in a position to bail out struggling schools as the reduced numbers are impacting on their own finances.

We urge any school experiencing difficulties to contact us and we can give advice and offer support. It may seem daunting to governing bodies to implement staffing reductions but it is probably necessary and our schools are doing it equitably and professionally with the right advice. Any school moving into deficits without an action plan will quickly find that costs escalate making them vulnerable in discussions about future viability. If you do have concerns, please contact Sam, Daniel or Angela for a discussion. Where a solution may be establishing a SEN resource base, again contact us early in the process so we can assist and give approval.

## Financial Benchmarking and Insights Tool

The School Information (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2025 ("the 2025 Regulations") comes into effect on 16 June 2025 and requires governing bodies of maintained schools to publish on their website a link to the specific page on the Financial Benchmarking and Insights Tool, that is dedicated to their school. The purpose of the 2025 Regulations then is to amend the 2008 Regulations, so as to replace "Schools Financial Benchmarking website", with "Financial Benchmarking and Insights Tool".

## **DFE Consultation- School Support Staff Negotiating Body**

The DfE launched its consultation on proposals for setting up the SSSNB on 11 June 2025. #### The consultation closes on 18th July 2025.

The Government intends to give greater recognition to the value and professionalism of the whole school workforce through establishing the SSSNB which is an important part of delivering its Plan to Make Work Pay and Opportunity Mission. The SSSNB will have a remit for pay, terms and conditions, training, and career progression for support staff in all state funded schools in England.

In order to ensure that the SSSNB is set up to reflect the context in schools today, the DfE is consulting on:

- the definition of 'school support staff' for the purposes of SSSNB, this will determine which staff are within the remit of the SSSNB
- whether to include agency workers in the scope of the SSSNB in the future.

They are also gathering evidence on current pay and conditions arrangements for school support staff. It is important that school support staff are encouraged to engage with the consultation. Employers and school leaders are encouraged to respond.

## Support Requested – Global Survey for Catholic Teachers (UMEC-WUCT)

# NPQ places for November 2025 start

The Avila Partnership (the partnership of Ursuline High School, Wimbledon and St Philomena's Catholic High School for Girls, Carshalton) is a provider of National Professional Qualifications (NPQs), run in association with The Church of England and Catholic Education Service. The qualifications are nationally recognised and accredited by the Department for Education.




