Reflection

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Welcome back to school, and I trust you have had some form of rest during the summer months. September is such a special and beautiful month. It brings with it numerous liturgical feasts and celebrations for us to reflect and continue to grow in our Faith. Soon, the leaves on the trees will start to change their colours, and the days will begin to get even darker. In the Church's liturgical calendar, we remain in ordinary time. In many ways, September is always a month of profound change.

In our Catholic world, this September, we thanked God for two new Saints, as our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, declared on 7th September that Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati and Blessed Carlo Acutis are Saints, officially recognising that God has already glorified them in Heaven. Saint Frassati said: "If you have God at the centre of all your actions, then you will reach the goal and Saint Acutis said: "To always be close to Jesus, that's my life plan". Both are young men who continue to inspire our world.

As we continue in September, let us take some time to reflect on the major celebrations we have. Firstly, we have three Marian Celebrations: 8th, the Feast of the Birth of the Virgin Mary; 12th, the Feast of the Most Holy Name of Mary; and 15th September, the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows. May our Mother Mary continue to pray for us all. Next, on Sunday 14th, we celebrate the Exaltation of the Cross, a special day for us in Education, because we celebrate Education Sunday. It is very fitting that the theme for Education Sunday 2025 is "The Son of Man must be lifted up", taken from St John's Gospel (John 3:13-17). The Bishop's Conference for England and Wales remind us that: "Education Sunday is one of the oldest Days of Special Prayer in England and Wales, established 175 years ago in 1848. It provides an opportunity to celebrate and give thanks to all involved in making Catholic schools places of enlightenment, as well as to look forward in anticipation of the year ahead. ... [It is always worth remembering that] the Catholic Church was arguably the first provider of schools and universities in England and Wales..."

At the end of the month, on the 29th, we will celebrate the feast of our three Archangels, Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. On that day, we thank them for their constant intercession for us before the throne of God. Finally, on the 30th, we celebrate Saint Jerome, a doctor of the Church who translated the Bible into Latin. St. Jerome is such an inspiration for this Jubilee Year, as we continue to encourage everyone to reflect on Scripture.

There is a date I would like you to keep in mind. It is not a feast, but it happens each year, often unnoticed. On Tuesday, 16th September, it will be 100 days until Christmas Day.

Whatever September brings, let us ask the Lord to give us the graces we need. Amen.

This report examines the relationship between attendance and academic achievement for pupils in state-funded mainstream schools during the 2022 to 2023 academic year at the end of:

- key stage 2
- key stage 4

The study, which builds on previous research from 2016, uses a regression model to account for various factors that could influence attainment, such as prior performance and pupil characteristics.



It uses recent data to look at how similar pupils with different attendance rates perform, isolating the impact of attendance on the likelihood of achieving successful outcomes at each key stage.


Collaborating with the charity, <u>Business 2 Schools</u>, we are able to offer our schools free furniture donated from businesses.
