

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## Reflection

Beloved Friends, Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There is going to be a baby in the Crib. He is coming. He will be here on Christmas Eve, and now we wait. We prepare, we get ready for this baby who is the saviour of the world, the prince of peace, Jesus Christ, our Lord and God.

For the next four weeks, we enter the holy season of Advent, our hearts turn with hope and gratitude toward the newborn Christ in Bethlehem. Amid the flurry of school activities, exams, and preparations, we are invited to pause and rediscover the gentle presence of God who comes to dwell among us, not in grandeur but in simplicity and love. He comes to bring peace to a world that is hurting and in need of healing.

I believe you are now preparing the various nativity scenes in your schools and homes. That familiar nativity scene offers enduring lessons for our school communities. In the humility of Mary and Joseph, the openness of the shepherds, and the generous gifts of the Magi, we are reminded that each of us—students, teachers, and parents—has a role to play in welcoming Christ anew into our hearts and into our schools so that no one feels left behind, or alone.

The four weeks of Advent will lead us gently into the Christmas Season, which begins on that most holy of nights we call Christmas Eve. At the Mass that night, the Priest will approach the crib in the Church and say:

"Hail and blessed be this hour and moment in which the Son of God was born of the most blessed Virgin Mary, at Midnight in Bethlehem, in piercing cold. In this hour, vouchsafe, oh God, to hear our PG 1



prayer and grant our desires, that those who come to pray before this image of the most Holy incarnation, may be granted all they need for body and soul, through the merits of our saviour Jesus Christ and of His blessed mother. May this crib and all who pray here be blessed + in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Hearty we approach your crib O Lord, to find the one of whom the prophet spoke, and here behold the mighty God lay helpless on the straw, Oh grant us some of this humility, that we may conquer mightily the reign of sin within us and grant us too the protection of your gentle mother whose tender eyes and loving heart attends your every wish. You who live and reign with the Father, and the holy spirit, God forever and ever. Amen."

Make this prayer your own this Christmas. Make it your inspiration when you walk in your school corridors and classrooms. Make it your strength to help those who are lonely or vulnerable, offering the gift of friendship and compassion, as Christ Himself did. In this prayer, we find an invitation to be present to each other this Christmas. Do not stand afar off; come close. Be present to your families and friends. And for those who will be travelling this Christmas, we wish you a blessed and safe journey, with God's abiding presence, protection, and peace as you travel.

As I remind you each year, take time to rest during the Christmas Holiday, as we look forward to a Happy and Blessed New Year 2026, when it comes.

May this holy season renew our joy, deepen our faith, and inspire us to bear Christ's light to all we meet—wishing our entire Catholic Education community a blessed and peaceful Christmas, filled with hope, joy, love and above all: Peace.
